Position Overview

The **Director of Development** will lead all aspects of fundraising and development for the orchestra, including major gifts, corporate sponsorships, grant writing, and donor stewardship. The Director of Development will work alongside the Executive Director, Fundraising Committee, and staff to achieve revenue goals that support the orchestra's artistic and educational initiatives.
