The Niagara Symphony Orchestra is seeking an experienced and detail-oriented Production Manager to oversee all technical and logistical aspects of concert production and to stage manage our concerts. This position will manage the entire production process for

performances, rehearsals, and special events, working closely with the NSO staff, artistic team, musicians, and production staff to ensure high-quality, seamless experiences for both performers and audiences. The ideal candidate has a strong background in live music production and/or theatre production, excellent leadership skills, a deep commitment to a positive working environment, and bringing world-class music to life on stage.

Key Responsibilities:

- Production Planning & Execution: Develop and oversee production plans for all
 concerts, rehearsals, and events, ensuring all logistical, technical, and scheduling
 requirements are met. Attend production meetings and provide production details
 to venues.
- **Technical Management:** Supervise tech crew in the setup and operation of stage equipment, audio-visual components, lighting, and other technical elements, addressing any issues promptly to minimize disruptions.
- Stage Manager: Act as stage manager during concerts (backstage coordination with venue technical crew)
- **Health & Safety Compliance:** Ensure all production activities comply with health, safety, and accessibility regulations, proactively addressing potential risks.
- **Event Coordination:** Serve as the primary on-site production lead for concerts and events, directing setup and teardown and supporting smooth transitions on stage.
- Communication & Reporting: Act as the central point of contact between departments for production needs, providing regular updates to the Director of Operations and preparing post-event reports.

Qualifications:

- **Education:** Bachelor's degree in Music, Arts Administration, Technical Production, or a related field (or equivalent work/education experience).
- **Experience:** 1+ years of experience in production management within a performing arts organization or theatre-style venue, preferably with a focus on live music or orchestras.

Skills:

- Excellent organizational and project management skills, with the ability to prioritize and multitask.
- o Strong technical knowledge of stage, lighting, sound, and AV equipment.

- Proficient in job-related software, scheduling tools, such as MS Office Suite, and production software such as Sketchup Pro.
- Exceptional communication and interpersonal skills.
- Experience managing production budgets and vendor relationships.
