At camp, we take attendance every day. If you know that your camper will be away for the day, it is very important that you let us know! Please contact us by 8:30AM on the day of the absence

THE FIRST DAY

Classes begin at 9:00AM on Monday, July 7 for Session 1 and Monday, July 21 for Session 2. Please plan on arriving approximately 10 minutes early to allow yourself and your camper to get acquainted with the new facility and meet our friendly and knowledgeable staff! Following a familiarization tour of the building with their classes, all

campers and staff will attend the big SMC welcome and introduction to our faculty, staff, and volunteers.

CONCERTS

The Final Concerts are a chance for our young musicians to showcase all they've learned at camp. For many, it is their first time performing - others can't get enough of the stage! On this special occasion, we ask campers to dress up, please no jeans. Due to the positioning of the stage, campers wearing a skirt or dress to the concert must make sure that it is at least knee-length or longer or is worn with leggings. If a skirt is too short, they WILL **NOT** BE ALLOWED TO APPEAR ON STAGE.

Session 1 Concerts will be held on Thursday July 17 at 5:30PM & 7:30PM Session 2 Concerts will be held on Thursday July 31 at 5:30PM & 7:30PM

The 5:30PM concerts feature the Early Years classes (JK – Grade 3). Please have your campers back at Beacon between 5:00 – 5:15PM. We anticipate this concert will end at approximately 6:30PM. The 7:30PM concerts feature the Ensemble & Orchestral classes (Grades 3 – 10). Campers performing in this concert should arrive between 7:00PM – 7:15PM. Campers have been instructed to head directly to designated "green room" classrooms while parents can head directly to the gym, SMC staff and volunteers will be at the entrance to assist.

During the concerts, campers will be supervised in the green rooms until it is their time to perform. Seating for attendees is first come, first served; so, arrive early! To ensure constant supervision, campers remain in the green rooms until the entire concert is finished. At that time, they will be escorted to the gym.

Seats at the concerts are limited; as such, each <u>family</u> is guaranteed **two seats** to the concert your camper or campers are performing in. If you would like to request extra seats, visit the SMC Admin staff posted at the entrance before or after camp everyday, or email SMC Director Karlie Boyle at <u>karlie.boyle@niagarasymphony.com</u>. If you do not need your initial two seats, or plans change and you can release initial or requested extras, please notify a member of the camp staff **AS SOON AS POSSIBLE**.

If you or your family and friends would like to see any of the concerts but can not attend the evening performance, you are welcome to attend a dress rehearsal during the day of the concert. Please be aware - this will not be a final performance and there will be lots of shuffling and waiting. More information regarding dress rehearsal schedules will be sent via email during the second week of each session.

MEDICAL AND SAFETY INFORMATION

All SMC staff members are trained in CPR and First Aid.

Information Release

During your camper's time at SMC, there will be opportunities for them to appear in still photos or videos. If you **DO NOT** want your campers' image to appear in NSO communications, please contact a member of the SMC Admin Team at karlie.boyle@niagarasymphony.com.

Camper Safety

In compliance with the Niagara Symphony Association's safety policy, every staff and faculty member, as well as volunteers over the age of 18, will have a current Vulnerable Sector Clearance Certificate issued by Regional Police. **NEW THIS YEAR:** To ensure the safety of all our campers we will be requiring guardian ID for pickup. If the person picking up your camper is NOT either the primary or secondary guardians listed on your registration form, please contact the SMC Admin Team at karlie.boyle@niagarasymphony.com.

Allergies

Please ensure that you have indicated any allergies your camper may encounter at SMC during your registration. If any changes occur, please inform a member of the SMC Admin Team by emailing karlie.boyle@niagarasymphony.com. It is required that campers at risk of an anaphylactic reaction bring two EpiPens to camp, one of which will be kept in the office, the other to be kept with the camper at all times. We have found that a fanny pack is the best way for your camper to carry their EpiPen. Please label all EpiPens with the camper's name. The spares can be picked up from the SMC staff on the last day of camp.



Peanut Free

SMC is a peanut free camp! Please be aware that some campers are severely allergic to nuts. **Snacks or lunches containing nuts are not permitted at camp.** We have a snack exchange just in case, but it won't be enough to replace an entire lunch! To keep everyone safe during lunch and recess just follow these simple steps:

- 1) Only bring peanut and tree nut free snacks
- 2) Wash your hands before and after eating
- 3) Do not share your lunch or snack

Medication

If your camper needs medication while at camp, please list them during registration. With the exception of EpiPens and asthma puffers at your direction, all medications should be properly labeled and stored in the office, not with the campers. Guardians will provide the following information if SMC staff are required to administer medication to campers:

- The reason for the medication
- The name of the medication with the camper's name on the container
- Written instructions of administration, including explicit permission to the SMC staff to administer it

Fire Drills and Lock-Down Procedure

In order to acquaint the campers with a safe method for exiting the building in case of emergency, we will describe the procedure to the campers, and the SMC faculty and staff will be instructed on proper fire drill and lock-down procedures prior to SMC.

Sun Sense

Summers can get very hot! The facility is air-conditioned, but the campers do go outside during recess and lunch. Sunscreen is recommended, as well as a hat and sunglasses. We recommend that campers bring their own reusable water bottle labelled with their name to use at water fountains; this way everyone can stay hydrated and safe!

EXTRAS

Extended Care

For campers needing addition supervision outside of regular SMC hours Extended care is available from 8:30 AM to 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM to 5:30 PM for a flat fee of \$150. Please note that no staff will be available to supervise campers outside these hours. Extended care is offered on all days of SMC, however please note that on CONCERT NIGHTS extended care will end at 5PM.

Late pickup fees apply at a rate of \$1 per minute after 10 minutes late (4:10 PM for campers not in Extended Care and 5:40 PM for campers that are in Extended Care) Long & McQuade

MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS *

Instruments

Campers who are registered in the Ukulele, Guitar, Strings or Brass & Winds classes will be provided a rental instrument free of charge. If your camper requires an instrument but indicated during registration that they would be providing their own, please contact a member of the SMC Admin Team at karlie.boyle@niagarasymphony.com immediately, as instrument rentals must be arranged in advance of the start of camp with the St. Catharines Long & McQuade. Please note that acoustic guitars are not the same as classical guitars.

Theme Days

We offer a variety of dress-up theme days for our campers, from Superhero Day to Crazy Hat Day! Each family will receive a calendar indicating the theme days as well as the craft schedule so that both guardians and campers can stay informed. It is not mandatory to dress up for theme days, but highly recommended! Graphic T-shirts are a great way to showcase Theme Day support!



Crafts

During each lunch hour, full day campers may choose to participate in making the daily craft. Materials for most crafts are provided, but don't forget to bring a shirt for tie-dye day!



SMC 2025 Souvenir & Tie-Dye Day!

The camp souvenir is an SMC T-Shirt! Because this shirt is white, full day campers are welcome to tie-dye it if they wish. If your camper would like to tie-dye a different white shirt, please bring one from home. We ask that all white shirts for tie-dye be <u>labelled clearly with the camper's name!</u> In addition, we ask that each camper only bring one item to tie-dye, as we have a large number of campers, and we want to ensure that everyone has an equal opportunity.

Expensive Technology

We request that campers do not bring expensive technology to SMC. If campers do bring their cell phone to camp, we will ask that it be accessed only at recess and lunch, and in the case of emergencies. We also ask that campers leave personal gaming devices at home as SMC is a time for friends, fun, and music! If a camper brings any of these items and they are found to interfere with programming, they may be held in the office to be picked up at the end of the day. The Niagara Symphony cannot be responsible for any items lost, stolen or damaged.
