

As they learn compositional techniques and notation skills, they will work with the in-school composer to transform their initial ideas into structured musical concepts. Along the way, students will delve into the meaning behind music by recognizing how ideas are communicated and by providing personal, critical responses to their work. This hands-on process not only enhances their technical abilities but also nurtures a deep appreciation for both the creative journey and the finished composition.



The First Ontario Performing Arts Centre is located conveniently in downtown St Catharines at 250 St. Paul Street. Partridge Hall seats 770 people and has an instant wow factor with natural acoustics and is one of the best equipped professional performance spaces in Niagara.





PARKING & VENUE ACCESS

There are more than 1,000 spots in nearby downtown parking garages, surface lots, and on city streets within a five-minute walk to the PAC. We recommend the multi-level covered garage on Garden Park (the address is 71 Carlisle St. but the entrance is off of Garden Park) with 595 spaces and 26 accessible spaces. For pickup and drop-off only, please use the the accessible drop-off point located on Carlisle Street.

City of St. Catharines metered street parking is generally free after 6pm. Parking charges apply at most city parking lots. Special Event parking fees are in effect when events are happening. Payment is by cash only and is paid on entry.
